It is some while since Miss Pettit devoted a complete season to hurdling; it would seem that she will not repeat her best time of 11.4 until she does. Specialisation is the price we must pay for higher standards.

## Men tail

In the men's Joe Louis meeting Ilford were second at the half-way mark, but did not finish in the first three.

Best track time was that by Chris Surety, runner-up in the 400m. in 49.4. Winner was Belgrave Harrier Brian Morris running for the Metropolitan Police. Later, he ran the anchor leg in the 4 x 400m. relay, passing Surety and taking the Police from third to first. Ilford were third in 3m. 29.5s. first. Ilfo 3m. 29.5s.
